

## Summary

This option allows you to print both the Generic and Brand on the Label dependant on how the item was dispensed.

## Details



Then Click on Label Printer





Print Both Generic and Brand on label Y/G/N? <Y>es Always, or include Brand when <G>enerically Dispensed or <N>ever

**Y = Yes Always** print the Generic and the Brand name the drug on the Main Label - this option is not reliant on how you dispense the item, the Generic Name will appear underneath the drug name in brackets



**N = Never** Print the Generic Name of the drug just the brand name will appear



**G= Generically Dispensed** items will display the Both thee Generic item and the Brand name, but items that are not generically dispensed will only display the Brand Name.

An example of dispensing an item **Generically** would be entering say ZOCOR in the drug selection field then pressing enter and selecting the strength, then pressing the up arrow back to the drug field and typing GS and <ENTER>, then choosing a generic substitution to this drug. OR another way would be to enter ZOCOR into the drug selection screen then <ENTER> and highlight the strength that you wish to choose, then pressing F11 will display the generic substitutions for this drug.



An example of not dispensing Generically is just typing in the brand name say ZOCOR and pressing enter, and then selecting the strength of the drug, in this case only the Brand name will print on the label
